 - ii. Jeff Savoy: I'm finding that faculty and staff still have a lot of questions about classifying data. There is also the issue with UW-System having three levels of classification while we have four, which will have to be addressed going forward. It's difficult to create a bridge between the classification schemes because they don't always align.
 - iii. Scott Owczarek: We will need to work on more communication with schools and colleges, including roles and responsibilities. Will also need to balance complexity with simplicity for end users.
